Thought for the Day by Susan Winsor

This Sunday our theme as part of our Inclusive Church series is sexuality, where we are thinking about how many people are discriminated against.

My heroine is Vicky Beeching, the British Christian singer/song writer. When I was questioning my sexual identity and thinking about coming out, I was reading the LGBT+ women's magazine, Diva. At that time Vicky was a columnist and I remember thinking "that's really cool that someone is writing

about Jesus in a LGBT+ magazine!" I'd never heard of Vicky so looked her up online and found a video telling her story.

Vicky was a successful Christian singer/song writer working in America. She'd known she was gay since she was a teenager but found it difficult to reconcile her sexuality and faith. She was afraid to come out as an adult because she feared she'd lose her livelihood and friends. Eventually this made her very ill.

Our New Testament reading today is Galatians 6: 1-16 which talks about bearing one another's burdens and this is what Vicky bravely did. She decided to come out and bore the flack and vitriol for many of the LGBT+ community. It damaged her health and she lost her livelihood. She moved back to the UK where she's campaigned for LGBT+ rights.

Vicky has helped many LGBT+ Christians to come out and be the person God wonderfully made them to be, including myself. She has inspired me to help others. One way I do this is by marching with Christians at Pride each year. I hope it might help others watching from the sidelines struggling with their identity to see someone they can relate to.

Today's Gospel reading is about Jesus sending out his disciples. He asks them to travel light and rely on the hospitality of others. We are called to trust in God and trust in each other. This is what Vicky did on her journey of coming out and what I and many other LGBT+ Christians have done. I think this is also what we are called to do as a church community, to trust in God and trust in each other on this journey as an Inclusive Church.

Ringing World National Youth Contest: Saturday 5th July

Saturday 5th July sees both St Mary's and St Anne's hosting young bellringers from as far afield as Cornwall, Yorkshire, Kent and Lancashire in the Ringing World National Youth Contest. The RWNYC is one of the bellringing community's flagship events, with up to 350 young bellringers involved across about 35 teams. The Brumdingers, who practice at St Mary's will be competing at Edgbaston Old Church. St Mary's will have groups of young bellringers visiting for a lot of the day, including one of the actual competitions in the afternoon, while St Anne's will have ringing for a couple of hours in the afternoon.

Participants will work in groups to practise listening and discernment together. You'll also have opportunities to watch role plays and to ask questions in the full group sessions.
