Thought for the Day by Janet Thorne

This week the focus for us as an inclusive church is poverty.

Poverty is a world-wide blight on life. Not only does it mean a lack of sufficient money and resources equally distributed to meet basic human needs but those who are poor in spirit, lacking friends or suffering severance from their families, struggling to find a purpose in life, to belong, to be wanted.

Sadly, at present extreme poverty and human suffering is world-wide, much of it caused by man's inhumanity to man - war bringing injury, famine and cruelty and untimely death. Victimisation - bringing fear and terror. Humans now starving, bereaved and traumatised. Poor in spirit and hopeless.

Nearer to home, poverty surrounds us:

• Struggling families facing the constant advertising campaign of what we must have in order to live a satisfactory life, children with all their needs and wants, facing peer pressure and a fear of bullying and isolation if they do not conform, yet with parents who can barely provide their basic needs - an isolating situation.

• Older people often left alone who have not had the opportunity to build up a living wage pension, now struggling with life threatening choices, facing eternal hardships and loneliness.

• Those with no permanent home, forced to use the church yard as a night shelter and often facing abuse and being moved along.

As a church and as individuals, we can help to make a difference, although we can't solve everyone's problems.

There are food banks and opportunities to lobby our government. We can support charities that target poverty, support climate change and be mindful of how we lead our own lives and spend our money.

We have our practical solutions here in church - Coffee and Co, Warm Space, refreshments after church ser-vice, Tuesday teas, film club, Christmas Day Together and Stay and Play.

Being an inclusive church charges us to make sure that all that is done in the name of the church, the very being of the church is caring and compassionate.

It's not just about sharing our money and resources, although that is important but addressing our relationships and attitudes, our thinking and our doing, being aware of how others see us in all that is done.

At the feast of Pentecost the church is commissioned and we are called upon to live out what we proclaim. We are asked if we dare to share our riches in common and minister to each other in need?

There is also the opportunity to be anointed with oil. Both are optional; you are simply invited to come as you are, bringing and sharing your burdens with God who knows us deeply.

It takes place over ten Saturday mornings at St Mary's Convent, B19 1EB, followed by two practice Retreats in Daily Life. The ten sessions include topics such as Ignatian prayer, listening skills, what we are listening for as prayer companions, discernment and images of God. Participants will work in groups to practise listening and discernment together. You'll also have opportunities to watch role plays and to ask questions in the full group sessions.
