Morning readings for the Eleventh Sunday after Trinity: Proverbs 25.6–7, Hebrews 13.1–8, 15-16, Luke 14.1, 7–14

Thought for the Day by Cheryl Hall

Proverbs reminds us it's better to take the lower seat and be invited forward than to push ourselves to the front and risk being told to step back. Jesus picks this up in Luke's gospel, warning against the scramble for recognition and teaching instead that "those who humble themselves will be exalted."

These verses come to mind as I read about the meeting between Donald Trump and Volodymyr Zelensky. Politics is often about who sits where, who looks stronger, who gets the photo opportunity. But Scripture quietly points us to a different measure of leadership—one that doesn't depend on status or headlines but on humility, service, and care for those who can't repay us.

The writer to the Hebrews reminds us: "Let brotherly love continue... do good and share with others, for with such sacrifices God is well pleased." That's what God values—not how powerful we appear, but how faithfully we live.

In a world where pride and self-promotion dominate, the gospel calls us to another way. We don't need to fight for the best seat at the table. We are invited to trust that Christ, who is the same yesterday, today, and forever, sees us, honours us, and calls us to lift others up. That's where true strength lies.

Flowers in St Mary's

This week's flowers commemorate Mike Stocks on the 10th anniversary of his death.

Revd Joan Griffin

We are saddened by the news of the death on August 8th of the Revd Joan Griffin, who with her husband Harry was a valued member of St Mary's. She served as a Reader, was ordained deacon in a service at St Mary's in May 1992, and priest in the first batch of women priests in 1994. A trained singer, she had been a founder member of St Mary's Singers, but her unpaid ministry to St Mary's people was extensive and highly valued - preaching, confirmation preparation, pastoral visiting. In parallel she served as a Chaplain first at Selly Oak Hospital, then at the Priory Hospital - a life of dedication and commitment.

Her funeral will be at Holy Cross Billesley, the parish where she settled after leaving St Mary's. The service is on Friday 19th September at 1.30pm (Holy Cross Church, Beauchamp Road, Billesley Common, B13 ONS) followed by cremation at Robin Hood Crematorium and returning for the wake at Holy Cross Community Centre. May she rest in peace - and rise in glory!
