**Evensong** is a traditional service where some of the liturgy is sung. The service is from the Book of Common Prayer (1662) with psalms, canticles, hymns, prayers, readings and a reflection.

Morning readings for Trinity Sunday: Proverbs 8.1–4, 22–31, Romans 5.1–5 and John 16.12–15

# Thought for the Day by Fiona Chew

Our first reading today is from the book of Proverbs – a collection of sayings which were designed to educate humankind in the art of wise living. In chapter 8, Wisdom is personified as a female figure, created by God when the world did not exist- *"The Lord created me at the beginning of his work"* (v22). Wisdom says *"When he established the heavens, I was there, when he drew a circle on the face of the deep, when he made firm the skies above, when he established the fountains of the deep, when he assigned to the sea its limit* (v27-29).... *Then I was beside him, like a master worker; and I was daily his delight"* (v30). So Wisdom is describing herself as created by God and playing an active role in the Creation and the language in these verses is clearly an echo of the creation narrative of Genesis chapter 1. However, the identity of Wisdom has been much debated. The Oxford

Bible Commentary says that "she belongs at God's side but she is also at home in the world.....it reveals her place as the link between heaven and earth." Is this the same as the Holy Spirit? The fact that this passage is our Old Testament reading for Trinity Sunday, when we celebrate Father, Son and Holy Spirit has certainly left me contemplating the mystery and majesty of the Holy Trinity and maybe that is the intention?

## Churchwarden at St Mary's

As we discussed in our APCM, Angela Brown would like to stand as churchwarden at St Mary's for another year before stepping down. As the maximum tenure is six years, we met on Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> June and voted to temporarily disallow this six-year rule so that she can do this.

In order to elect Angela as churchwarden, we will hold another short meeting at St Mary's following the 10.00am morning service on Sunday 6th July. If you are able to attend, please do.

## Churchwardens - can you step up to take the role on?

(Nearly) every Parish Church ought to have two Churchwardens. Very soon we shall have <u>no</u> Churchwardens at either St Mary's or St Anne's. Every communicant on the electoral roll aged at least 21 is eligible to stand as Churchwarden - and the role is not exclusively for the older

members of the congregation: I was aged just 27 when I first became Churchwarden at St Mary's, working alongside Betty Clarke.

Why have Churchwardens? The Churchwardens are the foremost representatives of the congregation, responsible for voicing the thoughts and wishes of the congregation to the members of the ministry team, and to the bishop. They are keepers of the valuables of the Church and must ensure there is 'order and decency in the church and churchyard' (yes, churchwardens even have a power of arrest). Churchwardens are active in promoting the mission of the church, because church law requires churchwardens 'to use their best endeavours by example and precept to encourage the parishioners in the practice of true religion and to promote unity and peace among them'. It is very important to have someone willing to take on the office; without churchwardens the lay congregation is not properly represented, and it almost suggests the members of the congregation are not invested in the future of the Parish. Although Angela Brown has agreed to continue for one more year (subject to a vote of the parishioners allowing her to stand) there really needs to be someone from St Mary's willing to work with her to learn the role - and there definitely needs to be someone willing to step forward at St Anne's.

Appointment as Churchwarden is for one year at a time, with now a maximum of six consecutive years, but a churchwarden is not required to stay in office for the whole six year period. If you are invested in the future of our two churches, are confirmed and believe you can represent the rest of the congregation, can you consider stepping forward? If interested, please do speak with a member of the ministry team, with Angela, or with any former churchwarden.
